GOOD NEWS! We are pleased to announce that Drive Happiness has been successful in securing funding for both our Edmonton operations and our growing operations in the neighbouring communities. On February 26, Edmonton City Council voted to provide us with \$180,000 in one-time funding. The City will also be working with us over the next few months to help develop a sustainable model to support the on-going operations of Drive Happiness. In addition, we received a 3 year grant from the Province of Alberta and a grant from the Edmonton Community Foundation to assist with expanding our service to the communities surrounding Edmonton.
