SCALE UP FOR SENIORS

Every senior deserves to age healthily, safely, and with dignity and should have the choice to age at home in their communities. The Government of Canada created the Age Well at Home Initiative to help more seniors do this.

Drive Happiness was one of three Alberta-based nonprofits to receive this funding in July 2023. Esther Murphy Memorial of the Year Award

In 2023, Drive Happiness introduced the Esther Murphy Memorial Volunteer of The Year Award. This award is in memory of our Volunteer Driver, Esther Murphy. Esther was a long-time volunteer with Drive Happiness as well as a member of the Board of Directors. Esther was a caregiver at heart and an advocate of Drive Happiness. She was frequently requested on bookings and was highly regarded by the other volunteer drivers, the staff, and the board. In April 2020, Esther passed away very suddenly. It was a shocking loss for many, including her Drive Happiness family. A memorial award in her name is very fitting and something we know she would have been honoured by.

The first recipient of this award, Janet, has volunteered for Drive Happiness in the Edmonton zone for over five years. She was instrumental in getting dialysis patients to their treatments through the pandemic. Her dedication and diligence with our protocol are what Dr. Richard Lewanczuk meant when he stated to GOA that "Drive Happiness saved people's lives." Thank you, Janet, for all the work you do helping seniors get to where they need to go! 
Holiday 50/50 Fundraiser

Prospect Human Services ArtRecruits

ArtRecruits is an art-based, skill-building program by Prospect that teaches workplace skills in the art studio instead of a classroom. Participants in the program plan and facilitate art workshops for community members. Drive Happiness staff and volunteers participated in two workshops in 2023, working together to learn and create. Throughout **2023**, the Seniors Assisted Transportation Program continued to grow across the province. The need for expanded affordable transportation services for older adults in Alberta arises from several factors, including an aging population and limited transportation infrastructure, particularly in non-urban and rural communities. Individuals may encounter mobility and health issues that inhibit their driving ability or use conventional transportation options as they age. Drive Happiness helps to address:

- Accessibility: The lack of affordable transportation options prevents older adults from accomplishing simple tasks such as attending doctor's appointments or purchasing groceries. Many communities where DH operates lack taxi services.
- **Mobility/Inclusion**: Mobility remains an issue even when public transit or taxis are available. Many older adults rely on walking aids such as canes and walkers in public spaces. However, neither taxis nor bus drivers are mandated to assist older adults in navigating to and from the vehicle. This presents a significant challenge, particularly during the winter when snow and ice increase safety risks.

As Drive Happiness and the Seniors Assisted Transportation Program continue to grow, more older adults will have access to the resources they need to live and age well.


